The chief secretaries of all States/UTs.

Sub: Security of protected persons during their journey outside their State/UT.

Sir,

I am directed to say that in recent past this Ministry has received representations from several protected persons requesting permission to carry their PSO's during their tour outside their native State/UT. The matter has been examined in this Ministry carefully, and has been decided that although the basic responsibility for the security of a visiting protected person lies with the concerned State /UT under whose jurisdiction the protectee happens to be, the security personnel from the protecting State/UT may be allowed to accompany the protected person during their tours outside their State/UT if the tour is not more than 3 days. In case the visit is more than three days, the security personnel of the native State/UT may be relieved of their security duties by the security personnel of the visiting State/UT and provide security to the visiting protected persons as per their security categorisation. However, the security arrangements by the visiting State/UT authorities may be strengthened if the local situation so warrants. In this regard, this Ministry's letter no. VI. 23014/53/91-GPA.III dt. 08.11.91 may also be referred.

All States/UTs are requested to instruct their police authorities appropriately in the matter.
